Lessons Learned

- Thanks to everyone who provided feedback to our team on lessons learned. The information was collected, organized and presented to the steering committee. We interviewed 10 groups with a total of 47 individuals across our campus. There were 27 anonymous surveys completed and 7 individuals within that group had a requested one to one follow up discussion.
- In short, we learned that the things done well were the efforts of the project team and the formalized approach to managing the project. This was new for Acadia. There was also a recognition of the effort that it took to bring this project to life.
- As for what did not go well, training, both the quantity and the nature of it, as well as consultation were challenges. Resourcing of the project was also seen as a challenge for many.
- The most important area for improvement was training. This was shared widely with us as a way to improve further project implementations.
